"The families of children with autism from the St. Kitts Spectrum Services Centre continued their "PLAYing" in the water with dolphins! The children used their FDLs by interacting with the dolphins and staff. They shared attention, engaged, and communicated back and forth with the adorable creatures. Secondly, we are growing our services in St. Kitts and will be bringing an American SLP in May to live on Island. She will be the first Speech-Language Pathologist to live and work on the Island. She will use the Play Project with the children!

Lastly, in our efforts to grow and expand our services, we will be relocating our facility to a bigger and better place where children with receive ancillary interventions in addition to the Play Project. The new facility will include a 3,000 square foot sensory gym to help improve the children's sensory regulations."

Autism: The Potential Within describes the journey of Jacob Grant – a composite of all young children with autism – and his family as they learn The PLAY Project approach. Through a series of office visits, Dr. Solomon empowers Jim and Julie Grant to be Jacob's best play partners. He also guides them on how to use Jacob's misbehavior – tantrums in public, sibling rivalry, picky eating and sleep problems – to help him learn appropriate behavior and social skills. Over time, Jacob moves from nonverbal to constantly talking, and from self-isolation to being warmly connected.
